Ballinamore is a very well developed Coarse Angling Centre which has hosted numerous All-Ireland Championships a established a reputation for warm and friendly hospitality. Situated amongst the hills of East Leitrim with 28 lakes with minute drive of Ballinamore, plus 17Km of Riverbank. Ballinamore has been catering for the Angler since the 1940's. I waters of the Erne are close to the watershed of the mighty Shannon River system and Angling in the area is varied with selection of waters to choose from. Bream averaging 2.5 lbs, going up to 7lb specimens. Roach run at 8-10 ounces, goin 1.5 lbs. There are also good Trench waters in the area. Access to the waters has been well provided.
